Randomisation Time for recruited patients

Please note that the randomisation time entered on the ambulance data form should be the time when the GTN patch +/- gauze dressing is applied on the patient and not the time of obtaining consent.

Although the post treatment BP/heart rate should be ideally recorded at 15 minutes after randomisation, this may vary depending on how far the patient is from the hospital. If the travel time to the hospital is going to be less than 15 minutes, the recording may be taken just prior to admission to hospital.

Patient review timings in Patient Report Form (PRF)

As it is important to ensure clinical trials aimed at the pre-hospital setting do not significantly delay transfer to hospital, we will compare the patient review timings and transfer timings between RIGHT trial patients and those patients who were admitted to Berman but not randomised into RIGHT.

Hence we would like you to kindly record the patient review timings; Time originated, Time Mobile, Time at scene, Time at patient, Time left scene and Time at hospital. This only needs to be recorded in the patient report form and not on the trial case report form.
